- Lawrence (Larry) Fargher passed away on June I4, 2022
- Larry was born September I6, I932, in Montana to parents Lawrence and Maude Fargher.
- He married Camille Fargher in Dwight Nebraska and they remained happily married for almost 50 years.
- Larry & Camille bought their first home in the City of Santa Clara in 1959. This is when his love for the City of Santa Clara began.
- Larry was involved in the growth of Santa Clara for over 50 years and served as Santa Clara
 City Councilman and was the Mayor of Santa Clara in 1964-1965.
- He ran for the California Congress and State Assembly as a devoted member of the Republican Party and served as a delegate to President Ronald Reagan at the Republican convention in 1980.
- Larry was named "Realtor of the Year" by the San Jose Real Estate Board in 1982 and elected to serve as their President in 1983; he was also a Member and Director of the CA Association of REALTORS.
- Larry was awarded the California Distinguished REALTOR for 2005 by the CA Association
 of REALTORS, was awarded the Byron Brawley Lifetime Achievement Award in 2007 by
 Santa Clara County Association of Realtors and awarded Realtor Emeritus by the National
 Association of Realtors for over 40 years as REALTOR.

- He was awarded the Austin Warburton Award by the Mission City Community Fund for community service and was an active member and Past President of the Santa Clara Rotary Club for 48 years.
- Larry was a Little League Coach, neighbor, landlord, and beloved friend to many who cherish the handwritten birthday cards and notes he always sent.
