

Sustainable Landscape Measures



Urban Habitat

- Conserve and use native plants
- Manage invasive plants
- Conserve healthy soils and appropriate vegetation
- Use vegetation to minimize building energy consumption
- Reduce urban heat island effects



Water Conservation

- Manage stormwater on site
- Reduce water use for landscape irrigation by selecting plants with low water needs
- Adopt recycled water for irrigation and landscape maintenance and chose plants that will thrive on recycled water



Resource Management

- Provide for storage and collection of recyclables
- Recycle organic matter
- Plan for sustainable site maintenance
- Protect air quality during landscape maintenance





Public Neighborhood Park

- Designed using a parks-come-first concept
- Park Dedication to the City:
 - Up to 10.5-acre neighborhood park.
 - Up to 0.3-mile (1,600 feet) trail at the southern end of the park, adjacent to the Hetch-Hetchy.
 - Minimum 3,000 square foot community room.
- Connectivity to the surrounding transportation network, e.g., VTA light rail stations, bus stops
- Located directly north of the future Patrick Henry Drive specific plan neighborhood park.










Site Circulation

Bicycle Network

- Connects into a larger existing bicycle network in the region.
- Provides bike lanes at Patrick Henry Drive, Tasman Drive and Old Ironsides Drive.
- Bicycle lanes and trails shall follow the standards and guidelines in the Patrick Henry Drive Specific Plan and the City of Santa Clara Bicycle Plan.






Site Circulation

Pedestrian Network

- Accessible pathways and sidewalks for strolling, jogging, and circulation.
- Santa Clara Trail extension to the south.
- Supported by clear wayfinding and efficient connections.





Planting Strategies

Drought Tolerant Tree Palette

- Plants will be purchased from local nurseries located in compatible climate.
- Plant material from commercial nurseries will either be sourced conventionally or by contract growing, depending on quantities and type of plants specified.
- The palette on the right identifies some, but not all, of the climate-appropriate tree species that will be considered throughout the Park and landscape.

Planting Strategies

Understory Planting Palette

- Water Intelligent & Climate-ready Plants
- Designed with careful sensitivity to water limitations, while still featuring colorful native and adapted grasses, perennials, flowering shrubs and succulents.
- Chosen for durability, drought-tolerance, flower and foliage coloring, and structural interest.
- Suitable for recycled water irrigation.
