Discussion of Cultural Commission Work Plan Goals and Activities for FY 2022/23

Recommendation: Discuss Cultural Commission work plan goals and activities for FY 2022/23.

> Goal #1. Host and enhance multicultural events to encourage and acquaint Santa Clara residents with cultural diversity: The Committee met to determine preferred venues, dates, genres and bands for this year. They confirmed the Summer Concert Series dates and locations: June 9 at Central Park Pavilion, June 23 at Live Oak Park, July 21 at Central Park Pavilion, August 18 at Central Park Pavilion, and September 29 at Live Oak Park. The committee submitted preferred genera of music to staff for the Summer Concert Series and the Street Dance. Staff will secure acts with City vendor. Committee will facilitate a Commissioner attendance calendar. Miss Santa Clara may attend some of the events.

Sponsorship: The Sponsorship Packet is almost complete. Once completed, the Commission can begin securing sponsors to help cover expenses.

Goal #2. Develop and encourage interactive art opportunities to provide temporary, performing, cultural, and public art in the City:

- Public Art: Commissioner von Huene reported that she is meeting with Santa Clara University on a potential collaboration.
- Utility Box Update: Chair Diaz reported that all six (6) Utility Boxes have been completed by the artists.
- Public Art Map Completed Utility Box will be added to the Art Map by Chair Diaz.

Goal #3. Raise the visibility of commemorative month celebrations: Vice Chair Samara and Chair Diaz reported that they are have discussed the coloring book project to update the coloring book with the Federal Commemorative Months with the preferred artist. The artist is working on a draft version of the coloring book and it is expected to be completed in the summer.

Goal #4. Enhance communication and media strategy to increase community awareness of the Cultural Commission.

- Commissioner Marinaro expressed interest in updating the collateral in the Commissioners marketing files.
- The Commission will provide an update to Council on March 21 as special order of business.

Goal #5. Prepare for Citywide Arts Master Plan Process: The sub-committee reported they are working with contacts and collaborating to develop a path forward to develop an Arts Master Plan. Staff will follow up with which development project has a potential art requirement. Interested in doing a community engagement process to develop an Arts Master Plan that is similar to other cities in the region.

MEETING DISCLOSURES

The time limit within which to commence any lawsuit or legal challenge to any quasi-adjudicative decision made by the City is governed by Section 1094.6 of the Code of Civil Procedure, unless a shorter limitation period is specified by any other provision. Under Section 1094.6, any lawsuit or legal challenge to any quasi-adjudicative decision made by the City must be filed no later than the 90th day following the date on which such decision becomes final. Any lawsuit or legal challenge, which is not filed within that 90-day period, will be barred. If a person wishes to challenge the nature of the above section in court, they may be limited to raising only those issues they or someone else raised at the meeting described in this notice, or in written correspondence delivered to the City of Santa Clara, at or prior to the meeting. In addition, judicial challenge may be limited or barred where the interested party has not sought and exhausted all available administrative remedies.

If a member of the public submits a speaker card for any agenda items, their name will appear in the Minutes. If no speaker card is submitted, the Minutes will reflect "Public Speaker."

In accordance with the requirements of Title II of the Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990 ("ADA"), the City of Santa Clara will not discriminate against qualified individuals with disabilities on the basis of disability in its services, programs, or activities, and will ensure that all existing facilities will be made accessible to the maximum extent feasible.
