



Public Park Network

Conceptual Parkland PHDSP & Mission Point





- Each Park Area will include different active and passive recreational programs;










Community Feedback


- The survey results and community feedback received at the community events during the Fourth of July All City Picnic and the Art & Wine Festival support the online survey results.


Conceptual Park Plan Changes

Updated Conceptual Park Plan












Initial Conceptual Private Recreational Amenity Plan








Updated Conceptual Private Recreational Amenities

Public Park Network


- This Public Park will be a connection to the public parks in the Patrick Henry Drive Specific Plan.

Public Parkland Delivery




Conceptual Public Parkland Phasing Plan



Site Circulation

Bicycle Network

- Connects into a larger, existing bicycle network in the region.
- Provides bike lanes at Patrick Henry
 Drive, Tasman Drive and Old Ironsides
 Drive, and the new Santa Clara Trail
 extension to the south.
- Bicycle lanes and trails shall follow the standards and guidelines in the Patrick Henry Drive Specific Plan and the City of Santa Clara Bicycle Plan.






Site Circulation

Pedestrian Network

- Accessible pathways and sidewalks for strolling, jogging, and circulation.
- Santa Clara Trail extension to the south.
- Supported by clear wayfinding and efficient connections.
- Detailed pedestrian network to be defined during design phase




Conceptual Pedestrian Network Diagram



Public Parkland and Private Amenity Summary

- Public Parkland:
 - Approximately 7.6-acre neighborhood park.
 - Approximately 0.3-mile (1,600 feet) trail at the southern end of the park. The trail will be completed in a single phase.
 - Approximately 3,000 square foot community room.
 - Final park boundary is subject to further definition during design phase.
 - The public park delivery will be based on public safety and availability for use within a multi-phased development program
- Private Residential Amenity:
 - Approximately 4.8-acres of private recreational amenities proposed
- Park design presentation will return to the Commission at a later date for recommendation to Council.





Recommendation

Provide comments to the Developer on the updated Conceptual Design presented for a new neighborhood park to be located at 3005 Democracy Way.
