#### **MEETING DISCLOSURES**

The time limit within which to commence any lawsuit or legal challenge to any quasi-adjudicative decision made by the City is governed by Section 1094.6 of the Code of Civil Procedure, unless a shorter limitation period is specified by any other provision. Under Section 1094.6, any lawsuit or legal challenge to any quasi-adjudicative decision made by the City must be filed no later than the 90th day following the date on which such decision becomes final. Any lawsuit or legal challenge, which is not filed within that 90-day period, will be barred. If a person wishes to challenge the nature of the above section in court, they may be limited to raising only those issues they or someone else raised at the meeting described in this notice, or in written correspondence delivered to the City of Santa Clara, at or prior to the meeting. In addition, judicial challenge may be limited or barred where the interested party has not sought and exhausted all available administrative remedies.

If a member of the public submits a speaker card for any agenda items, their name will appear in the Minutes. If no speaker card is submitted, the Minutes will reflect "Public Speaker."

In accordance with the requirements of Title II of the Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990 ("ADA"), the City of Santa Clara will not discriminate against qualified individuals with disabilities on the basis of disability in its services, programs, or activities, and will ensure that all existing facilities will be made accessible to the maximum extent feasible. The City of Santa Clara will generally, upon request, provide appropriate aids and services leading to effective communication for qualified persons with disabilities including those with speech, hearing, or vision impairments so they can participate equally in the City's programs, services, and activities. The City of Santa Clara will make all reasonable modifications to policies and programs to ensure that people with disabilities have an equal opportunity to enjoy all of its programs, services, and activities.

Chair Liang discussed how she gained a better understanding of Santa Clara County's free distribution of Narcan by mail, how other commissions have conducted voter registration drives, and how they have been urged to help youth advise their schools in developing policies in response to the Phone-Free School Act.

Commissioner Arias Hernandez promoted the Caltrain Holiday Train which is an annual charity event that occurs in the Bay Area and raises money in collaboration with the Salvation Army. There will be stops at ten different stations on December 7th and 8th.

Commissioner Gaidhani talked about the Youth Commissioners who

volunteered at the Children's SpooktaClara Halloween party and helped manage a carnival game booth during the party.

#### **SUBJECT**

#### **BACKGROUND**

The Youth Commission develops an annual work plan through discussions of current trends and civic needs that relate to the youth and teen population. The annual work plan drives the activities of the Commission throughout the term. The Commission established several goals over the past few terms including promoting health and wellness, providing public outreach and education, and fostering community building.

### **DISCUSSION**

At the October 8, 2024, meeting, the Youth Commissioners discussed their work plan priorities and goals for this term. The work plan priorities include:

- Public Outreach and Education: online resources for Santa Clara residents and volunteering opportunities
- Community Building with our Santa Clara residents: community events and multicultural activities.
- Youth Empowerment in the community: teen talk podcasts, study support for high school students, and mental health challenges.
