



Background

- As part of the 2023 Governance and Ethics Committee workplan, Council Policy 020 was scheduled to return for Committee discussion.
- Vice Mayor Anthony Becker brought forth a written petition regarding both recognition items and policies for speaking at public events.
- On December 12, 2023, the City Council voted to refer the item back to the Governance and Ethics Committee.
- Council Policy 020 and Council Policy 009 currently have guidelines pertaining to ceremonial events and recognition items.

Council Policy 020

- Council Policy 020 identifies the authority, criteria, and procedure for the recognition of individuals, groups, organizations, businesses, special periods of observance, or special occasions:
 - Proclamations
 - Commendations
 - Certificates of Recognition

Proclamations

- Highlights specific periods of observance (e.g. days, weeks, months), civic celebrations, or community, regional, state, or national occasions.
- Recognizes issues, actions, and/or programs of significance to Santa Clara.
- Proclamations should deal with local, county or state issues that have a connection to the City.
- Typically presented at the beginning of City Council meetings under "Special Orders of Business".



Commendations

- Commendations are issued to individuals, groups, organizations, or businesses with a connection to the City for major achievements with community-wide significance.
- Local sports teams or individuals winning titles, competitions, championships at the state, national, and or international levels
- Milestones or commemoration
- Retirement of City or SCUSD employees
- Presented at City Council meetings under "Special Orders" or at related events

Certificates of Recognition

- Certificates of Recognition are issued to individuals, groups, organizations, or businesses with a connection to the City for achievement, exceptional contributions to the community, or commemorative events.
- Presented at City Council meetings under "Special Orders" or at related events.



Council Policy 009 - City Representation at Meetings, Ceremonies, and Special Events

- 1. The Mayor and/or City Council shall represent the City at meetings, ceremonies, and special events.
- 2. If staff receives a request for representation of the City at an event, the following occurs:
 - a) The invitation is referred to the Mayor.
 - b) If the Mayor is unable to attend, the invitation is referred to the Vice Mayor.
 - c) If the Vice Mayor is unable to attend, the invitation is referred to Councilmembers in order of seniority.
 - d) The City Manager (or a designee) will represent if the Mayor and Council are not available.
- The City Council may officially request a City Board or Commission member to represent the City on certain occasions.
