Please adjourn the August 25, 2020 City Council meeting in memory of the following individuals:

**Frank Kadlecek, Long-Term Santa Clara Resident and Former Senior Advisory Commissioner**

- Frank Edward Kadlecek was born on June 27, 1932, in Engelwood, Colorado to Joseph Kadlecek and Vilma Safarik Kadlecek.
- Frank grew up on a farm outside of Atwood, Colorado. He served in the US Army, reaching the rank of 1<sup>st</sup> Lieutenant, and was stationed in Austria, Italy, as well as several stateside locations.
- After leaving the service, he completed his bachelor's and master's degrees at the University of Northern Colorado, Greeley, and later received a Doctor of Education from the University of California, Berkeley.
- On the path to his doctorate, he participated in several science education programs as a part of the National Defense Education Act.
- Frank will be remembered fondly by hundreds of students and fellow educators in the Santa Clara Unified School District, where he taught all grade levels for over thirty years, focusing on STEM curriculum, as well as serving as vice principal.
- His interest for the betterment of education led him to serve on the Board of Education for the Berryessa Union School District.
- Frank had a love of sports, which began in his youth when he played on baseball teams for his local high school and junior college.
- In recent years, he played softball with the Santa Clara County Vintage Softball Club, an over-50 league. The league honored him with the Armen Parseghian Award in 2007 and Lifetime Achievement Award in 2012. He also coached many school sports teams.
- Frank's interest in serving the community led to volunteering at the Santa Clara Senior Center, where he worked for many years as a local coordinator and tax preparer for the AARP program, as well as in the gym. He also served on the City of Santa Clara Senior Advisory Commission.
- Frank passed away on August 2, 2020, at the age of 88.

- Frank was pre-deceased by his siblings Maryanne, Ruth, Charlie, Jack, and Jim.
- He is survived by his sister Joan Lippitt; his loving partner, Alice Pivacek; his former wife Shirley; his children, David, Terri, Paul (Sheila), Doug (Marla), Juliet, Mark (Katie); and his grandchildren- Cameron, Nathan, Jayson, Jordan, Portia, Augie, Zoë, Otto, Ellie, Ian, and Abbie; and many nieces and nephews.

### **Richard Wah Sung Goo, Long-Term Santa Clara Resident**

- Richard Wah Sung Goo was born on December 19, 1927, in Wailuku, Maui Hawaii to George and Lucy Goo, who owned and operated a market and the famous Lucy Goo's Lunch and Pastry shop in Wailuku; Richard was the youngest of seven children.
- Richard attended Saint Anthony's High School and DeVay Electronics School, where he pursued his interest of and skill in electronics; he worked in the family business after school and served in the Hawaiian National Guard during World War II.
- He married his high school sweetheart, Joyce Sakamoto from Makawao, on November 11, 1950. They shared a love of dancing; their favorite was the foxtrot.

- After their wedding, they worked at the Dole Pineapple Cannery, bought their first home in "Dream City," now called Kahului.
- Richard, Joyce, and their daughter Joanne moved to California in 1956. Soon after, Richard began working as a technician at Hewlett-Packard.
- The Goo family moved to their new home on Pomeroy Avenue in 1960, after Hewlett-Packard opened their Frequency and Time Division in Santa Clara, now known as Agilent Technologies
- During his tenure at Hewlett-Packard, the company made significant advances in instrumentation with frequency and time technology.
- After a long and successful career, Richard retired as an Associate Electronics Engineer in 1986.
- Richard was always interested in the latest electronics; his household was the first to have a digital clock and top loading VCR.
- He often used a ham radio to stay in touch with his buddies on the islands. He enjoyed cheering on local sports teams, taking daily walks in the neighborhood, working on his yard, maintaining his large collection of mechanical toys, and attending Sunday mass at Saint Justin's Church.
- Richard lived during the most eventful century of this world's history and had the great fortune of witnessing the fastest change and progress of mankind.
- Richard passed away on August 7, 2020, at the age of 92. He will be deeply missed by his family and friends.
