Recommendation on General Plan Amendments for the Freedom Circle Future Focus Area and the Greystar Development Project

Recommendation:

That the Planning Commission adopt Resolutions recommending that the City Council:

- 1. Adopt a resolution approving and certifying the Final EIR prepared for the Freedom Circle Future Focus Area Plan and the Greystar Project General Plan Amendment (SCH #2020060425), including CEQA Findings and a statement of overriding considerations.
- 2. Adopt a resolution approving a General Plan text amendment to add language regarding the creation of additional Future Focus Areas, the re-designation of land outside of Focus Areas, creation of the new Very High-Intensity Office/R&D designation, and adoption of a General Plan Amendment to create the Freedom Circle Future Focus Area.
- 3. Adopt a resolution approving the Greystar General Plan Amendment from High Intensity Office/R&D (maximum Floor Area Ratio of 2.0) to Very High Density Residential (51-100 Dwelling Unit/Acre.

The time limit within which to commence any lawsuit or legal challenge to any quasi-adjudicative decision made by the City is governed by Section 1094.6 of the Code of Civil Procedure, unless a shorter limitation period is specified by any other provision. Under Section 1094.6, any lawsuit or legal challenge to any quasi-adjudicative decision made by the City must be filed no later than the 90th day following the date on which such decision becomes final. Any lawsuit or legal challenge, which is not filed within that 90-day period, will be barred. If a person wishes to challenge the nature of the above section in court, they may be limited to raising only those issues they or someone else raised at the meeting described in this notice, or in written correspondence delivered to the City of Santa Clara, at or prior to the meeting. In addition, judicial challenge may be limited or barred where the interested party has not sought and exhausted all available administrative remedies.

If a member of the public submits a speaker card for any agenda items, their name will appear in the Minutes. If no speaker card is submitted, the Minutes will reflect "Public Speaker."
