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Solid Waste Rates

- Services
 - Garbage
 - Yard Trimmings
 - Residential Recycling
 - Clean-up Campaign (CUC)
- Rates for each service that a customer subscribes to are combined into a bundled rate

Compensation Adjustments

- Agreements specify cost of living adjustments
 - Primary reason for rate increases
- Effective July 1, 2026
 - MTWS increase @ 4.70% (WST Index)
 - GWR increase @ 3.04% (Bay Area CPI)
 - Recology increase @ 5.09%
 - 0.39% (Route growth); 4.70% (WST Index)
- Rates based on 4.5% increase to WST
 - BLS revised the 2025 change to 4.7% after Prop 218 notices were developed

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City Program Costs

- Solid Waste Program portions of City's Cost Allocation Plan and Technical Services increases
 - Cost Allocation Plan - \$100k
 - Technical Services - \$290k
- Costs are incorporated into FY 2026/27 rates

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Rate Stabilization Reserve

- Target balance of 10% of annual expenditures (\$4.5 M)
- Preliminary estimate is \$2.9 M (6.4% of annual expenditures)
- \$483k allocated in FY 2026/27
 - \$68k to cover for BLS revision of WST from 4.5% to 4.7%
 - \$415k to fund street sweeper amortization costs
 - Increase from \$134k in FY 2025/26 shift to electric sweepers

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O&M Reserve

- Target balance of 25% of annual expenditures (\$11.3 M)
- Preliminary estimate is \$7.3 M (16.2% of annual expenditures)
 - \$400k allocated in FY 2026/27 for emergency backup and collection systems enhancement for closed landfill CIP project

- Most jurisdictions have a separate charge for organics collection service
- Most jurisdictions anticipate rate increases in FY 2026/27

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Public Hearing

- Solid waste customers may submit oral or written protests until the close of the Public Hearing
- At close of Public Hearing, protests are tabulated
 - 35,984 notices were sent on March 27, 2026
 - If protests tabulated are 50 percent plus one (17,993), the proposed fees cannot be imposed
- If there is not a majority protest, Council can make and act on a motion to increase fees

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Recommendation

Conduct a public hearing, tabulate protest votes, and if less than a majority protest is tabulated, adopt a Resolution setting the overall rates to be charged to rate payers for the collection and disposal of garbage, refuse, yard trimmings, recycling, and annual Clean-up Campaign in the exclusive franchise area, including increases in rates and other adjustments effective for the utility bills issued for services rendered on and after July 1, 2026.

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Santa Clara History – MWP vs Split Cart

- Year Long Pilot Program.
- Cart issues (heavy, breaking, parts availability, etc).
- Many residents not using split cart.
- Some cutting inside of cart to remove split cart barrier.
- Loss of garbage space.
- Food waste smell and leakage.
- Survey data showed majority not in favor of split cart.
- Survey showed majority willing to spend a little more per month for MWP.
- Council directed staff to move forward with MWP.
- MWP is higher level of service, does not require residents to self-sort.

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Santa Clara Rate vs Milpitas/Sunnyvale Rates

- Cannot make a direct comparison with these rates.
- Milpitas/Sunnyvale carts have about 30% less space for garbage per container size
- Santa Clara TH rate (20% of cart subscriptions) are less than Sunnyvale/Milpitas for almost all subscription levels.
- Sunnyvale runs their own solid waste facility, it is unclear how revenues factor into their solid waste rates.
- Santa Clara rates include services such as street sweeping, leaf vac, holiday tree collection, and the closed landfill.
- Unclear how Sunnyvale/Milpitas fund their programs including any use of franchise fees or general funds.

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Other Considerations

- MWP through GWR contract is recovering more organics and recyclables from landfill.
- MWP ensures organics removal.
- Split Cart organics & recyclables can still end up in landfill.

What this means:

Across every comparable cart size, Santa Clara residents pay materially more than residents in Milpitas and Sunnyvale. Additionally, Milpitas seniors above 62 years pay only 50% of their regular rates.

Past bad policy decision by council is costing our residents millions in garbage rates.
