

- Originally built in 1966 it's been vital to Santa Clarans recreation and fitness
- 3 pools: a shallow learn-to-swim pool, a 50-meter competition pool, and a dive well with a tower
- Thousands have learned to swim, maintained their health, connected with their community, trained, and competed

\$11 Million Marguerite Aquatics Center in Mission Viejo, CA (2018)

- Originally built in 1972, renovation completed in 2018
- 3 pools: a shallow learn-to-swim pool, a 50-meter competition pool, and a dive well with a tower
- Host over 50+ events a year

\$1.15 Million William Woollett Jr. Aquatics Center in Irvine, CA (2025)

- Addition of a third 50-meter competition pool
- Addresses a rise in requests from local programs and national competitions
- Signature and National events generate \$1.5-2.2M in local economic benefit
