Concert Noise Levels

Background: Written Petition

- June 21, 2022 Council considered a Written Petition submitted by Anurag Aggrawal and Ajay Thadhlani and other residents of North Santa Clara near Levi's Stadium Petitioners
- Petition referenced impact of noise upon residents from the Sunday,
 May 15, 2022 Coldplay concert and fireworks
- Council voted unanimously to place the item on a future City Council meeting agenda





Concert Noise Levels

Unattended Noise Monitoring

Wilson Ihrig & Associates performed analysis of noise data received from unattended noise monitoring station





Concert Noise Levels

Attended Noise Monitoring

For The Weeknd and Elton John Concerts Wilson Ihrig performed attended (live) noise monitoring at the Cheeney & Lenox station and locations where residents previously shared noise complaints through the Written Petition regarding the Coldplay Concert





Concert Noise Levels

Regulatory Context

- 1. Stadium Permit Conditions of Approval:

 Maximum sound level exposure at the nearest residences to the east and south of Stadium shall be a target of 60 dBA Leq (1 hour average)
- 2. Noise levels predicted in Stadium EIR:

 Concert noise levels would be approximately 66 dBA Leq or less at the nearest residences south of the stadium
 - Hourly average noise levels would exceed ambient hourly average noise levels by 4 dBA Leq and background noise levels by 19 to 24 dBA

Concert Noise Levels

Analysis Methodology

- 1. Analysis differentiates jet noise from concert noise by automated filter or by detailed manual analysis
- 2. Analysis reflects refinements to account for jet noise, so not to attribute jet noise to concert noise levels
- 3. Analysis accounts for the drop in noise levels that occurs between the nearest residential use (e.g., a rear yard property line) and the location where noise monitoring took place



Concert Noise Levels

Analysis Results

- 1. Coldplay (May 15, 2022) exceeded Stadium Permit noise level target by up to 9 dBA Leq and the concert-noise level predicted for the EIR by up to 3 dBA Leq
- 2. The Weeknd (August 27, 2022) exceeded Stadium Permit target by 3 dBA Leq, but did not exceed the concert-noise level predicted for the EIR
- 3. Elton John (October 9, 2022) did not exceed either the Stadium Permit noise level target or the concert-noise level predicted for the EIR

Concert Noise Levels

Next Steps

- 1. Results suggest that noise levels vary from concert to concert and can be influenced by the way in which the concert is conducted
- 2. Staff will work with stadium management so that future events at the stadium conform with City requirements
