





# Calabazas Creek Trail Crossings

- 3 Pedestrian Overcrossings:
  - Crossing Options at Caltrain/JPB/HSR adjacent to Calabazas Creek
  - Pedestrian Overcrossing at Central Expway adjacent to Calabazas Creek
  - Pedestrian Overcrossing at Highway
     101 adjacent to Calabazas Creek
- 6 At-grade Crossings:
  - Pomeroy Avenue
  - El Camino Real
  - Warburton Avenue
  - Cabrillo Avenue
  - Machado Avenue
  - Monroe Street

#### Calabazas Creek Challenges

- Requires three pedestrian overcrossings that need right-of-way
- Sea level rise has potential to impact downstream trail undercrossings








# Hetch Hetchy Corridor Land Availability Map





- Elevation changes connecting to Calabazas Creek, San Tomas Aquino Creek and Guadalupe River





#### Saratoga Creek Challenges

- Vegetation Preserve from 1980s flood control improvements - Pruneridge Avenue downstream to Monroe Street at the confluence with San Tomas Aquino Creek
- Limited land along the top of bank to fit a trail










# **Survey Results Preferred Trail Design Features**

### **Survey Results General Comments**

- I think these trails would be a great addition to the bike network in Santa Clara and would definitely get me to take additional trips by bike that are currently too difficult. However, these need to be part of a broader network for them to be truly useful.
- Bicycles and cars don't mix well. Dedicated bike routes by far work the best if we can't reduce the number of cars on roads.
- It would be great to have a better-connected bike network, and better enforcement of existing traffic safety laws.
- Really excited to see a proposed path running along Calabazas Creek! It would pretty much connect my house to my workplace and make my bike commute even nicer. And a Hetch Hetchy connector to the Guadalupe Path would be nice too. I hope that the path could be wide and smooth enough for roller blading too.
