



Why AB 481

- September 30, 2021 Gov. Newsom signed 8 police reform bills, including Assembly Bill
 481: Military Equipment Funding, Acquisition and Use
 - Increase transparency, accountability, oversight for acquisition and use of equipment
 - Provide safeguards to protect public's welfare, safety, civil rights and liberties



AB 481 Requirements

- · Post a draft Policy and Department equipment inventory online 30-days prior to a Public meeting
- · Create a Public forum for community input
- Seek Governing Body approval of a Policy and Ordinance, and prepare an Annual Report to include:
 - how equipment is being used
 - maintenance and use costs
 - internal audits
 - community feedback on use
 - * SCPD's first annual report is planned for May 2023
- · AB 481 requires approval for the acquisition of funds associated with "military" equipment
