WHEREAS, September 15th is a significant starting date for National Hispanic Heritage Month because it is the anniversary of independence for the Latin American countries of Costa Rica, El Salvador, Guatemala, Honduras and Nicaragua; in addition, Mexico and Chile celebrate their independence

on September 16th and September 18th, respectively; and

as of 2025, Hispanic or Latina/o residents represent nearly 16 percent of Santa Clara's population and are a vital part of the region's rich history, WHEREAS,

economy, culture, and community.
