Background

- At the March 24, 2020 City Council meeting:
 - -Staff reported to Council on the various programs at the Federal, State and Local levels for small businesses
 - -Council directed staff to develop a COVID-19 relief program for small businesses in Santa Clara
 - -Council approved the allocation of \$250,000 for the relief program

Background

- City Council also expressed interest in the following:
 - Working with the Silicon Valley Central Chamber of Commerce (Chamber) on assistance with growing the City's initial investment
 - -Minimizing "red tape" to distribute funds quickly

Sacramento	Loans	\$1 million
Seattle	Grant	\$2.5 million

Grant Versus Loan

- Grant program allows City to get capital to small businesses without burden of additional debt
- A loan program doesn't necessarily help a small business in the long run
- Grant program can be administered with current City staff
- Loan program would require City to engage a 3rd party administrator

Grant Program Overview

- Businesses and nonprofits with at least one but no more than 25 full-time employees who demonstrate a loss of income due to COVID-19
 - -\$10,000 grants for those deemed non-essential*
 - -\$5,000 grants for those deemed essential*
- Grants will be awarded on a first-come, first-serve basis for qualified applicants
 - *Per the County of Santa Clara Public Health Department order dated March 16, 2020.

Eligibility Requirements

- Applicants must:
 - -Demonstrate loss of income due to COVID-19
 - Operate out of a physical commercial storefront in Santa Clara
 - -Have an active City of Santa Clara Business License
 - −Be in good standing with the City
 - -Have been in operation in Santa Clara for at least one year as
 - of March 1, 2020



Outreach & Promotion

- Application period opens week of April 13, 2020
- City will promote the program via the City's website, social media, press releases and e-Notify
- City will work with the Silicon Valley Central Chamber of Commerce to promote the program through its communication channels



Other Small Business Programs



Small Business Utility Assistance

- Flexible payment plans for Water and Sewer and Electric utilities for businesses impacted by COVID-19
- Interested small businesses shall include the Economic Injury Worksheet to demonstrate loss of income from COVID-19
- Flexible utility bill payment plans are not tied to applications for the Small Business Assistance Grant Program and can be submitted independently
