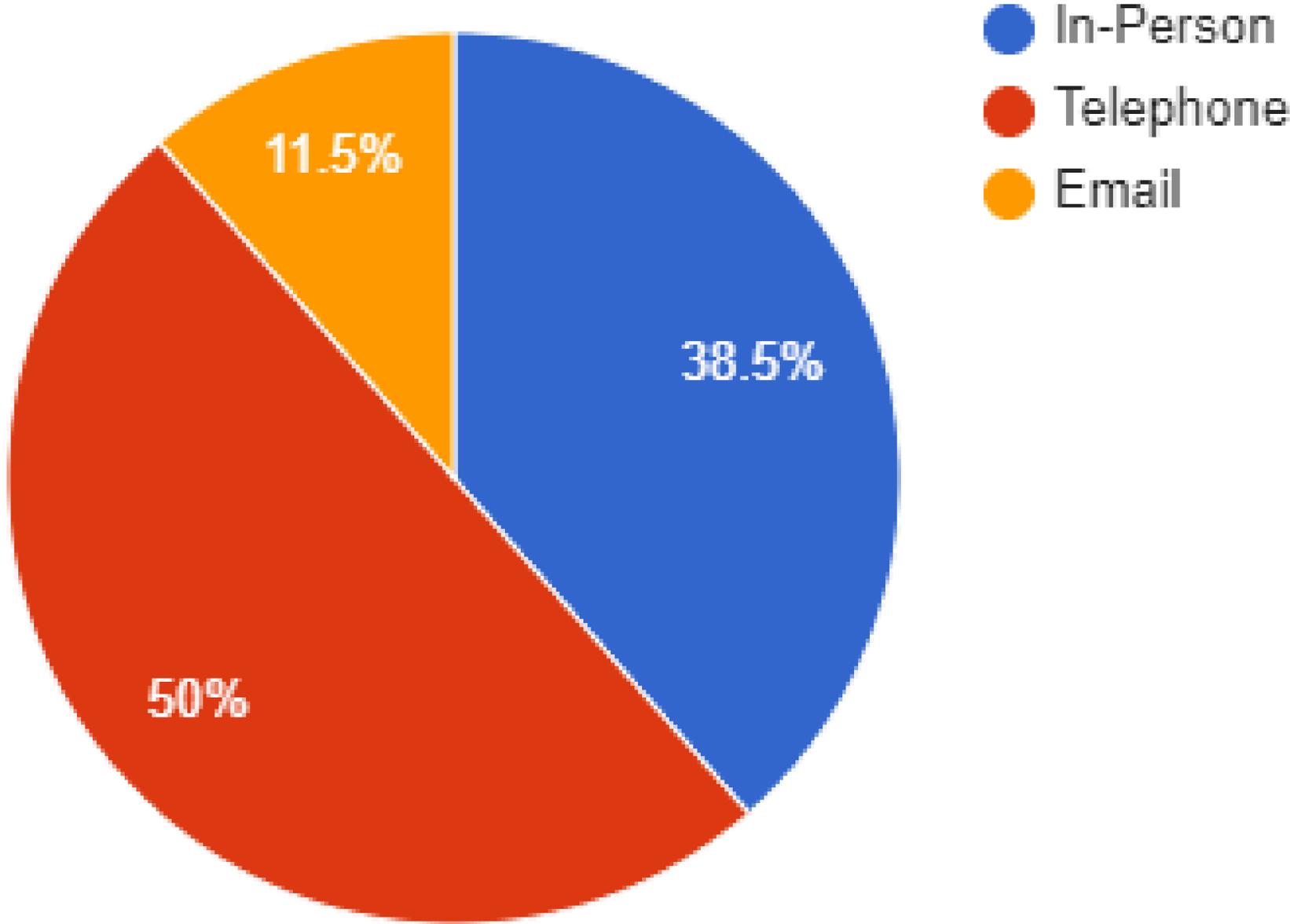
Current Engagement
