Background - 2017 Public Outreach Policy

- Exceeded State Requirements through requiring:
 - On-site posting
 - Web site notifications
 - Community meetings
- Purpose: Engage stakeholders early in the process

- 2. Desire to better engage hard to reach populations
- 3. Incorporation of Post COVID-19 best practices
- 4. Embrace new technologies for outreach
- 5. Opportunity to clarify policy language and set expectations

What are the changes?

- · Revised definitions for clarity
- Early notification requirements for projects without community meetings
- Encouragement to use 3rd party community engagement specialist for hard-to-reach populations
- Improved logistics for community meetings
- Initial visioning meeting for General Plan/Rezones
- Increased notification radius for large/Significant interest projects

Public and Planning Commission Feedback

- Improve equity in the outreach process
- Increasing notification requirements
- Provide reminders for people of the options to stay informed
- Requiring 3rd party engagement consultants for certain projects

Recommendations

The Planning Commission concurred with the staff recommendation with additional revisions:

Type of Project	Current Notification Radius	Staff Recommendation	Planning Commission Recommendation
Standard Project	500 feet	500 feet	1/4 mile (1,320 feet)
Large/Significant Project	1,000 feet	½ mile (1,320 feet)	½ mile (2,640 feet)

 The policy is subject to review by the Planning Commission after four community meetings or six months, whichever occurs first.

Benchmarking with Other Jurisdictions Notification Process

Jurisdiction	Noticing Radius
State Requirement	300 feet minimum
Cupertino	500 feet
Palo Alto	600 feet
East Palo Alto	300 to 600 feet
San Jose	300 to 1,000 feet
Santa Clara (Existing)	300 feet to 1,000 feet
Santa Clara (Staff Recommend)	300 feet to 1/4 mile (1,320 feet)
Santa Clara (PC Recommend)	300 feet to ½ mile (2,640 feet)

Summary

- Early notification of projects will allow people additional time to participate in the process and provide feedback when project revisions are more likely to occur.
- Additional guidance for community meetings will help enrich the process.
- Increasing the notification radius may not increase the interest in the project. It will increase the time and cost to process a project.
- The proposed Planning Commission recommended increases would make Santa Clara an outlier.
- Staff does not support the increase in notifications recommended by the Planning Commission.
- An alternative to increasing notices as recommended by the Commission is to gauge the public interest from the early notification and allow the Director to adjust the notification radius accordingly.



Staff Recommendation

That the City Council adopt the updated Public Notification, Outreach & Engagement Policy for Planning Applications, as modified by the Planning Commission except for the proposed increased notification distances.
