Peregrine Data Integration Platform

- Consolidates data from traditionally siloed systems into a single, secure interface
- Enables authorized personnel to conduct cross-system searches
- Improves situational awareness and operational efficiency
- Supports faster, more informed decision-making
- Serves as foundational software of voter approved Measure I RTIC

Does not create new data or expand Department authority

Data Sharing and Control

- Data sharing is not automatic
- Will occur only through approved MOUs
- The Department retains full control over what is shared
- Access will be limited by role-based and attribute-based controls
- Non-authorized requests will be redirected to source agency

Data sharing will be deliberate, controlled, and governed by the Department

User Access and Accountability

- Access will be limited to authorized personnel only
- Permissions will align with job responsibilities
- All system activity will be logged and auditable
- Routine audits will be conducted by the Department
- Misuse may result in administrative, civil, or criminal consequence

All system use will be subject to review and accountability

Cybersecurity, Data Protection, and Data Integrity

Security & Protection

- AWS GovCloud (CJIS-compliant)
- Encryption (at rest & in transit)
- Redundant architecture
- Authentication + role-based access
- Logged and auditable activity

Data Integrity & Retention

- Governed by law, policy, and retention schedules
- Platform mirrors system of record
- Does not create or alter data
- Corrections made in source system
- Updates reflected in platform

Security, data integrity and retention are governed by existing law, policy, and Department oversight

Public Trust and Key Takeaways

Trust, Oversight, and Control

- Transparency, clear standards, and compliance with applicable law
- Oversight, audit, and accountability
- One-year follow-up report to Council on usage and safeguards
- 30-day termination for convenience

Operational Value

- Does not expand Department authority
- Supports timely and informed decision-making
- Aligns with voter-approved funding for RTIC

The platform will operate within a framework of oversight, transparency, and Department control

Real World Impact

Connecting existing data for faster, more effective public safety

Recent Examples:

- Safely located and reunited a non-verbal autistic individual
- Identified and arrested suspects in sexual battery and public lewd conduct investigations
- Identified a homicide victim after over a month without leads

No new data. No new authority.

Just better use of the information we already lawfully have.

Recommendation

1. Authorize the City Manager or designee to execute an agreement with Peregrine Technologies, Inc. (Agreement) for an enterprise Data Integration Platform and related professional services for an initial five-year term with a maximum amount not-to-exceed \$1,179,689.98, subject to the appropriation of funds and approval of final form by the City Attorney;
2. Authorize the City Manager or designee to take any actions as necessary to implement and administer the Agreement, including (a) exercising up to five one-year options to extend the Agreement term, and (b) negotiating and executing amendment(s) to the Agreement to (i) increase the maximum compensation by up to \$1,622,311.40 (inclusive of \$254,727.40 contingency) for a total aggregate not-to-exceed amount of \$2,802,001.38 over the full ten-year term, (ii) add or delete services consistent with the scope of services, and (iii) make de minimis changes, subject to the appropriation of funds and approval as to form by the City Attorney; and
3. Approve the FY 2025/26 Budget Amendment in the General Fund to increase the Police Department budget in the amount of \$244,420 and decrease the Budget Stabilization Reserve in the amount of \$244,420 (five affirmative Council votes required for the use of unused balances).
