Introduction and Parties Involved

Agreement Overview

- Initial Agreement: Signed on February 20, 2018 Agreement is between Levy Premium Foodservice (Concessionaire) and Forty Niners Stadium Management Company (Stadium Manager)
- <u>First Amendment:</u> Signed on June 1, 2021 Stadium Manager granted the Concessionaire the right to provide certain food, beverage and catering services at Levi's Stadium

· Roles of the Parties

- o Stadium Manager: Responsible for overseeing operations at Levi's Stadium
- <u>Concessionaire:</u> Responsible for providing food, beverage, and catering services at Levi's Stadium

Concessionaire Service Standards and Requirements

First Class Service Requirement

- Concessionaire is required to deliver all Food & Beverage services to a "First Class" standard
- o Definition of First Class
 - Highest quality of service in comparison to three top NFL stadiums
 - Compliance with the terms of the Agreement, legal requirements, and Stadium Manager's standards
 - Includes health, safety, quality, customer satisfaction, and design standards set by the Stadium Manager



Concessionaire Service Standards and Requirements (cont.)

Sufficient Inventory

 Concessionaire must ensure enough stock of refreshments at all sales points throughout the Stadium during events

Key Products

- o Required to maintain inventory for the top five revenue-generating items in:
 - Food
 - Alcoholic Beverages
 - Non-Alcoholic Beverages
- o Products determined by previous year's sales or as directed by the Stadium Manager

Concessionaire Payment Structure and Calculations

NFL Events

- o Concessionaire's payment based on StadCo's share of Net Receipts
- Net Receipts = Gross Receipts from NFL Events minus certain costs (operational, joint, and management-related)

Non-NFL Events

 Payments calculated on a percentage of Gross Receipts from events organized by the Stadium Authority

Proposed Second Amendment

 Revises the definition of "Net Receipts" to change the allocation of Joint Operating Costs, increasing StadCo's share



Joint Operating Costs – Current and Proposed Changes

Current Joint Operating Costs

- o Fixed 51% of Joint Operating Costs
- Costs related to non-attributable NFL or Non-NFL Event operations of Food & Beverage services, including: office supplies, computer systems, utilities, cleaning services, pest control, costs of uniforms, smallwares, and necessary licenses or permits

Proposed Second Amendment

- A pro rata <u>Variable Rate</u> using the percent of Gross Receipts from NFL Events over the total Gross Receipts from both Stadium Authority Events and NFL Events for such Fiscal Year
- o New pro rata share for Fiscal Year 2024
 - 70% for NFL Events
 - 30% for Stadium Authority Events
- o Future years will have estimated and settled costs in a similar fashion

Impact on Net Receipts and Financial Implications

Net Receipts Definition

- o After-amendment definition includes the shift in Joint Operating Costs
- Net Receipts = Gross Receipts minus StadCo Operating Costs, Joint Operating Costs, preference payments, renewal funds, and other stipulated fees

Impact on Costs

- Forty Niners SC Stadium Company (StadCo) will assume a larger share of Joint Operating Costs, reducing the financial burden on the Concessionaire
- o No impact on the Stadium Authority's revenue, as their share is based on Gross Receipts
- o The Concessionaire's service standards remain unaffected by the amendment



Rationale for the Second Amendment

Reason for Proposed Change

 Adjust Joint Operating Costs to better reflect the financial responsibilities tied to NFL and Non-NFL events. Ensures StadCo covers a proportionate share of costs related to NFL event revenues

Pro Rata Allocation

 The 70% NFL / 30% Non-NFL event cost split more accurately reflects the revenues and activities taking place at the Stadium
