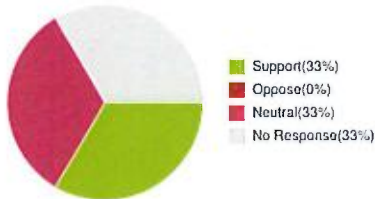

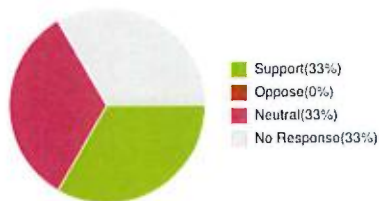

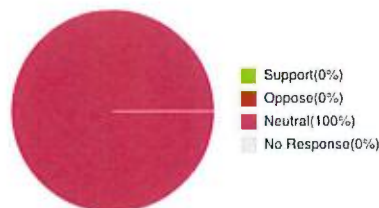

The Projects List shows that 8.5% of planned Tasman East housing units are "affordable." This percentage should increase, since those with the least ability to pay rent are most likely to work in the project's proposed retail shops. When low income workers live far from work, in areas with substandard or no public transportation, all car related fees fall on their shoulders and eat away at their low pay. A "sustainable" Santa Clara should welcome its workers to live within its borders.
