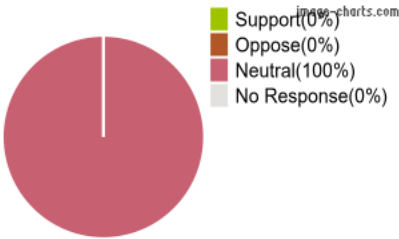

Overall Sentiment



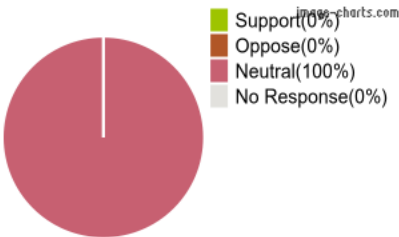

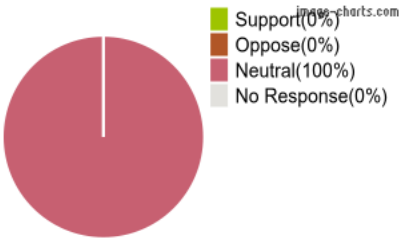

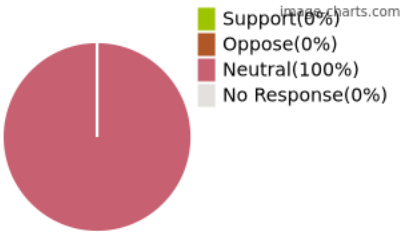
