recruit new foster (resource) families; and

WHEREAS, As part of National Foster Care and Resource Parent Awareness Month, the Santa Clara County Department of Family and Children's Services

(DFCS) recognizes the part we all play in enhancing the lives of youth in foster care. DFCS acknowledges that is also a time to appreciate caregivers and raise awareness about the critical need for more committed, nurturing, and consistent families where youth in foster care can thrive;

WHEREAS. Hundreds of community events are being planned throughout the month across the country to appreciate, retain, recruit and support foster

(resource) parents; and

WHEREAS. During the month of May, DFCS honors and acknowledges foster (resource) parents, youth who are in foster care, family members, and other
