Dear Mayor Gillmor and Councilmembers,

My name is April Smith. I am a life-long resident of Santa Clara County. I began participated in BMX at the Santa Clara track in 2008 at the age of 40. I was only going to race one time to live out a childhood dream, but then I got hooked on racing and soon was racing three times per week in Santa Clara, plus at other tracks throughout the west. My step-daughter raced with me for several seasons before she went off to college. Aside from racing, I have also supported the track as a parent volunteer. There is no better BMX program and facility than the one currently in Santa Clara. It is a shame that it is currently unavailable for the community to enjoy.

Through BMX, I have established many great long-term friendships, including with members of the current Santa Clara track operations team. I have never known them to be anything other than kind, honest, and relentlessly supportive of their children's desires and goals. The exceptional children they are raising - champions that are looked up to by younger children at the Santa Clara track as coaches, mentors, and role models on and off the track, are a testament to values and work ethic of the operations team as parents and leaders. I have personally seen the track operations team not only supporting and encouraging their own kids, but treating every kid (and adult) at the track with the same high level of encouragement and enthusiasm.

In all my years of racing and volunteering at the Santa Clara track I have not seen any member of the Santa Clara Police Athletic League Board (PAL) that spoke at the Town Hall meeting they hosted at the track in February. Over my years of racing, I have seen a police officer representative stop by about 4 or 5 events. The statements presented by the PAL Board at the meeting made it clear the Board does not have any idea how or why the BMX program works as well as it does. I think if anyone on the PAL Board had spent any time at all around the track on a race day, training day, or track maintenance day and witnessed the level of dedication and commitment to the success of the program that directly fills the PAL coffers, they would never have tried to oust the current track operations team.

As a matter of public record, PAL's most recent IRS 990 Form (2019: Section VII) indicates that of the 13 PAL officers and trustees listed, 12 of them spend an average of one hour per week conducting the organization's business. Not only does this pale in comparison to the countless volunteer hours amassed by the track operations team throughout each year, I am sure you will agree that is not sufficient oversight for the PAL Board to become knowledgeable of the operations of the track to the degree necessary to know what it takes to keep it going without the operations team that built it to the top-notch program it is.

The PAL Board stated that they desire to find another group of volunteers to step in and keep the program operational. The meeting in February was filled with concerned families that want to keep the USA BMX sanctioned BMX program running for the valuable contribution it makes to the citizens of Santa Clara and beyond. However, I did not hear any one of these parents, me included, state that they would be willing to match the enormous amount of time and devotion the

current operations team puts in to keep the BMX program running, let alone maintain its status as the best in the Country. I have participated in other organizations and volunteer groups, as I am sure you have. Often participation and committed leadership wain over time to the detriment of the program, as other priorities take hold. The current operations team has proven to be a solid leadership team that has stood the test of time. Their unwavering devotion to the program and its benefit to children should not be overlooked or taken for granted. It should be valued. It would be a mistake to allow them to be ousted without cause.

Please consider approving the agreement USA BMX is proposing, which allows the track to open and continue the awesome program with the current operations team that selflessly works to run a top-notch program and puts children first.
