Public Park Network

- The Public Park at Mission Point is a connection to the public parks in the Patrick Henry Drive Specific Plan.
- The adjacent public parks create a larger public park network.





- Each Park Area will include different active and passive recreational programs;
- Each Park Area will have unique planting design characteristics (e.g. color, texture, sense of smell) that provide a sense of orientation and direction as visitors meander through the park;
- Each Park Area will provide sufficient shade and seating areas.









Community Feedback


- The survey results and community feedback received at the community events during the Fourth of July All City Picnic and the Art & Wine Festival support the online survey results.









Conceptual Park Plan Changes

Initial Area vs. Proposed Area






Updated Conceptual Park Plan








Updated Conceptual Private Recreational Amenities









Public Park Network

Site Circulation

Bicycle Network

- Connects into a larger, existing bicycle network in the region.
- Provides bike lanes at Patrick Henry Drive, Tasman Drive and Old Ironsides Drive, and the new Santa Clara Trail extension to the south.
- Bicycle lanes and trails shall follow the standards and guidelines in the Patrick Henry Drive Specific Plan and the City of Santa Clara Bicycle Plan.






Site Circulation

Pedestrian Network

- Accessible pathways and sidewalks for strolling, jogging, and circulation.
- Santa Clara Trail extension to the south.
- Supported by clear wayfinding and efficient connections.
- Detailed pedestrian network to be defined during design phase





Public Parkland and Private Amenity Summary

- Public Parkland:
 - Approximately 7.6-acre neighborhood park.
 - Approximately 0.3-mile (1,600 feet) trail at the southern end of the park. The trail will be completed in a single phase.
 - Approximately 3,000 square foot community room.
 - Final park boundary is subject to further definition during design phase.
 - The public park delivery will be based on public safety and availability for use within a multi-phased development program
- Private Residential Amenity:
 - Approximately 4.8-acres of private recreational amenities proposed
- Park design presentation will return to the Commission at a later date for recommendation to Council.
