<u>Council Question</u>: Page 7 of 9 of the staff report discusses square footage-based measures. Do we know what is square footage of the residences vs commercial spaces (total number of taxable parcels is 28,888? The taxable parcels are separated out by land use categories: residential (27,240), commercial (756) and industrial (892). Do we know the square footage of each of the three types ? <u>Staff Response</u>: Based on data collected from the County of Santa Clara, through our Property Tax consultant, for the FY 2019/20 Assessed Tax Roll the building square footage by industry is as follows:

Commercial – 23,126,622 Industrial – 28,984,983 Residential – 57,690,663

<u>Council Question</u>: I would like to discuss business tax based on number of employees, similar to the measure passed by Mountain View in 2018.

<u>Staff Response</u>: Regarding an employee-based business tax, we currently have an outdated fee structure that varies based on number of employees and type of industry. An evaluation and update of the Business Tax could be done, however, would require significant consultant time and community outreach. This work would take over a year to complete.

I attended August 15, 2019, session at Central Library and was completely under whelmed.

1. Outreach, for the public comments, is very limited. Flyers in library, inserts in our monthly electric bill etc, might have solicited more responses..

2. Committee appears to get inputs for 6 districts, 3 districts or 2 districts but no scope for drawing district boundaries! If they recommend, 3 or 2 districts, then who and when district boundaries will be demarcated! May be better name could have been "District Implementation Committee".

3. There were only 185 responses, by August 15, 2019, - 5 of which were from non Santa Clara residents. With sample size so small, 180, committee wanted to know whether responses were statistically significant! Small sample size is result of inadequate outreach process.

In my opinion, all the efforts and associated expenses could have been better utilized to tackle City's other issues.

If City wins legal battle, will we have "Chapter Undo Committee"!

Also, only Santa Clara residents should decide it. Inputs from non Santa Clara residents should be ignored.
