The only exceptions are if the Board, Commissions or Committee determines that one of the following emergency situations exist: Work stoppage or other activity which severely impairs public health, safety or both, as determined by a majority of the members of the Board, Commissions or Committee; Crippling disaster which severely impairs public health, safety, or both, as determined by the majority of the Board, Commissions or Committee; or Upon a determination by a two-thirds vote of the Board, Commissions or Committee, or, if less than two thirds of the members are present, that the need to take action arose after the agenda was posted; or the item was posted for a prior meeting of the Board, Commissions or Committee occurring not more than five (5) calendar days prior to the date action is taken. In the event of a public presentation, the Board, Commissions or Committee or its staff may briefly respond to statements made or questions asked, or may proceed to the next item of business or adjourn. The communication not acted on shall be accepted by the Board, Commissions or Committee for placement on the agenda for the following Board, Commissions or Committee meeting, if requested by the citizen. Electronic presentations should be submitted to the liaison department to enable screening for compatibility and viruses. Contact the liaison department to ascertain when the material should be submitted. Written materials should be submitted to the liaison department to allow the City to copy such materials. Contact the liaison department to ascertain when the material should be submitted. Any written materials submitted during the meeting should include sufficient copies for the Board, Commissions or Committee and the public.

#### **SUBJECT**

Parks & Recreation Commission 2017-18 Work Plan & Goals Update

#### **BACKGROUND**

At the January 17, 2017 Parks & Recreation Commission meeting, the Commission developed the 2017-18 Work Plan. The plan was created through discussion of current issues and needs relating to city parks operations and maintenance, recreation programs and community services, cemeteries, and special events. The following goals were selected based on priority and community needs:

- Conduct a Comprehensive Facility Condition Assessment and Establish Priorities for Park Acquisition, Development and Rehabilitation
- Update Park Rules, Regulations, and Ordinances and Install new Park Signs
- Improve Access, Supervision & Enforcement at Parks & Athletic Fields
- Enhance Special Events through a Local Focus, new Activities & Collaboration with Cultural Commission

#### **DISCUSSION**

The Parks & Recreation Commission will provide monthly updates on the status of the Work Plan Goals for the year:

- A. Facility Condition Assessment
  - Work item completed. Council accepted the final report and Commission recommendation on April 24, 2018.
- B. Update Park Rules, Regulations, and Ordinances and Install new Park Signs
  - Staff is working on draft language for the Ordinance based on Commission recommended updates to park rules.
- C. Improve Access, Supervision & Enforcement at Parks & Athletic Fields
  - Commission provided feedback to SCUSD on plans to maintain and permit school fields.
    Additional dialogue and timeline for implementation is needed.
- D. Enhance Special Events through a Local Focus, new Activities & Collaboration with Cultural Commission
  - Commission continues to evaluate program enhancements at future Citywide special events and include dialogue with Cultural Commission after July 1, 2018.

Santa Clara Art & Wine Festival Planning 2018

#### **BACKGROUND**

The Park and Recreation Commission will review and discuss Art & Wine Festival planning for 2018 including: (a) four (4) glassware samples and prepare the order for the 2018 festival; and, (b) three (3) poster samples from two artists. The Commission will provide recommendation to staff on the glassware and poster selection.

#### **DISCUSSION**

The 38<sup>th</sup> annual Art and Wine Festival will be held in iconic Central Park over two days, September 15 to 16, 2018 This Festival is a fundraiser for many Santa Clara nonprofits. The Art & Wine Festival attracts over 50,000 visitors over the course of two days to visit and shop at over 160 artists' booths, go on rides in Kids Kingdom, sample local wines and artisan beers while enjoying entertainment on three stages. Last year the Commission provided \$89,000 to six Santa Clara non-profits with the proceeds of this event. Glassware is sold at the event. Posters are used for marketing and publicity purposes.
