The City of Santa Clara is one of several jurisdictions that play a part in managing, conserving, and expanding the urban forest of Santa Clara Valley through monitoring and performing tree related services within our local jurisdiction.

The Santa Clara Valley Urban Forestry Alliance (SCVUFA) plays an important role in creating opportunities for collaboration across municipalities, in establishing a unified approach to managing our urban forests and in providing community outreach. The City of Santa Clara is excited to be an active participant in the Alliance and the associated outreach that comes from this collaboration.
