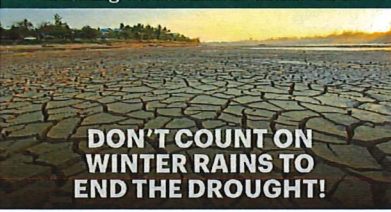

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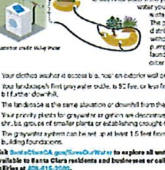
Why Ditch Your Lawn?

Landscape Conversion Rebate

Santa Clara residents looking to replace lawns are now eligible:

- \$4 per square foot for the first 1,000 square feet of irrigated turf
- \$2 per square foot thereafter
- Lifetime combined landscape rebate cap of \$5,000 per residential site applies
- Effective September 1, 2022
