Methodology



- Survey of Residents aged 18 and older in the City of Santa Clara
- Total of 600 completed surveys; Margin of Error ±4.0 percentage points
- ▶ Conducted February 20 27, 2024
- Mixed-mode (telephone, text- and email-to-web) methodology
 - Phone interviews conducted by trained, professional interviewers; landlines and mobile phones included
 - Residents were sent an invitation via email and text to complete the survey online
 - Survey was conducted in English, Spanish, Chinese, Vietnamese, and Korean

Please note that due to rounding, some percentages may not add up to exactly 100%.

Key Findings




- Residents are generally satisfied with life in the City of Santa Clara and the City largely receives good ratings for its provision of services.
- Issues around homelessness and the availability/development of affordable housing are top concerns and priorities for Santa Clara residents.
- While public safety is also a top concern, many residents do feel the city is safe. Still, investments in police and first responders are welcome.
- Other top issues of importance to residents include:
 - Economic development (downtown businesses and boosting the economy),
 - Road and sidewalk maintenance, and
 - Utility (water, sewer, and road) emergency response.

Key City Ratings



A majority of Santa Clara residents rate the City positively on key items.



Segmentation



Two thirds of residents have a positive outlook on Santa Clara.

<u>Excited and Happy:</u> Rate Santa Clara as an <u>excellent</u> place to live OR are <u>very satisfied</u> with the overall job the City of Santa Clara is doing AND agree that they are <u>excited for the future</u> of Santa Clara

<u>Future is Bright:</u> Rate Santa Clara as a <u>good</u> place to live OR are <u>somewhat</u> <u>satisfied</u> with the overall job the City of Santa Clara is doing AND agree that they are excited for the future of Santa Clara

Agnostic: Mixed responses or refusal/don't know

Disillusioned: Rate Santa Clara negatively in a majority of those questions



Segmentation by Subgroups




Both men and women under the age of 65, and those in CCDs 1, 4, and 5 are the happiest with life in Santa Clara.

Renters and those with household incomes above \$100k are the happiest with life in Santa Clara.



Affordable housing and homelessness are top of mind issues for residents.






City Ratings

Satisfaction with City Services



A majority of residents are satisfied with specific services the City provides, except for developing affordable housing. As a reflection of the City's pillars, responsiveness and communication rank highly, along with recreation and sustainability.



Availability of affordable housing in Santa Clara is a significant issue, with 3-in-5 residents expressing concern with loved one's ability to find an affordable home. Residents are split on whether the City is focusing on priorities that matter to them.







Priorities around climate change, sports and recreation, and Levi's Stadium are ranked as lower priority items.




How would you rate that item on a scale of one to seven, where 1 is a very low priority and 7 is a very high priority?




When asked about other priorities for the City, rent control and affordable housing are top mentions, as is crime reduction and community engagement.
