Library Services and the Housing Crisis

Housing and City Infrastructure

- Santa Clara needs more housing
- More housing means more people
- Infrastructure need to keep up with added housing and people
 - Streets (traffic)
 - Schools
 - Utilities
 - Public Safety (fire and police)
 - Libraries
- How to quantify library needs and maintain high level of library services?

Expected Population Increase: 50 Years of Historic Population Growth

- Estimated 2018 population: 127,134
- Housing in various stages (from City planning page)
 - Under construction, approved, in planning, specific plans
- 19,542 dwelling units
- 53,350 new residents, a 42% increase in population
 - Using 2.73 residents per dwelling unit
- Close to increase in population from mid-1960s to 2017
 - 50 years of population growth!!

Existing Conditions	Sq Ft	Items
Central Library	80000	341148
Northside Library	15000	70252
Mission Library	7700	12821

Projected Library Deficit Equivalent to Three Northside Libraries!

- Current "Quality of Service" measures for library services
 - (from Tasman East EIR)
 - 0.85 square feet per resident
 - 3.69 items per resident
- Scaled to 53,350 new residents:
 - 45,347 square feet of library space
 - 196,860 items
- Equivalent square feet
 - ~ 3 Northside Libraries
 - > 0.5 Central Libraries

Long-Term Planning for Libraries

- Who is responsible for long-term library planning for capital investment?
- East Tasman EIR: Schools, public safety covered
- But for libraries
 - Degradation in library services identified, but EIR conclusion were
 - No impact from project
 - No cumulative impact
