Chris Burrous, Former Santa Clara Resident and KTLA Anchor

- Chris was born on January 11, 1975 in Santa Clara County.
- Chris grew up in Santa Clara and graduated from Santa Clara High School.
- He began his broadcasting career while attending Chapman University in Orange County. He worked for radio stations in San Bernardino and San Jose before seguing to TV as an evening anchor on KEVN-TV, the Fox affiliate in Rapid City, South Dakota.
- From South Dakota Burrous returned to California in 1999 as an anchor for KGET-TV in Bakersfield and later worked for KGPE-TV in Fresno.
- He then spent six years in the Golden State's capital as anchor for KMAX-TV's "Good Day Sacramento."
- Chris passed away on December 27, 2018.
- Chris is survived by his wife, Mai, and their daughter, Isabella.

John "Jack" Moore, Father of Former Councilmember Kevin Moore

- Jack was born on July 31, 1925 in Byron, CA.
- Jack proudly served as a Corporal in the US Marine Corps (1943-46) with active duty in Saipan and Iwo Jima.
