Delores "Dolly" Gendreau, Longtime Santa Clara Resident

- Dolly Gendreau was born on December 10, 1918, in San Francisco, California.
- Dolly built B24 bombers in a factory for Consolidated Aircraft. Dolly also worked for Bell Telephone and then Kodak in Palo Alto.
- Dolly was an accomplished sailor. She sailed around the San Francisco Bay, the Sacramento Delta, and even Florida, where she travelled by boat for 11 years.
- Those close to Dolly describe her as fun-loving, extraordinary, and having a streak of mischief.
- She celebrated her 100th birthday on December 10th of this past year.
- Dolly was well known for sayings that always made people smile; she was loved by her fellow John Burns Gardens residents and considered everyone in the complex as her family.
- Dolly passed away at the age of 100, and is survived by her two children, two grandchildren, and two great grandchildren, as well as her surrogate family members.

Linda K. Smith, Lifelong Santa Clara Resident

- Linda was a life-long resident of Santa Clara.
- She was born on June 1, 1948 in Santa Clara, California.
- She served in the U.S. Marines.
- Linda was one of the first employees hired by Ross Dress for Less in the Mariposa Shopping Center, and was there for the store's grand opening.
