"The children on their own will tell me that they have to eat healthy. Now they ask me, 'Is this healthy?' I learned a lot, I used to think that granola and drinkable yogurt was healthy, I used to buy it so that they would at least eat something (if they didn't eat family meals), but not anymore. Now everyone wants to go for a walk after we eat. On their own they will tell me, 'aren't we going on a walk today?' I notice that they are sleeping better. The little one before would just eat all day and couldn't go to sleep without having cereal before bed and would wake up really early asking for cereal again and not anymore, she sleeps more."

In the City of Santa Clara, Healthier Kids Foundation screens children for undetected vision, dental, and hearing issues; Healthier Kids Foundation case managers follow-up with the parents of all children who receive a screening result that indicates a potential issue. This ensures that each child gets the care they need so that they are able to learn in the classroom. Healthier Kids Foundation also delivers 10 Steps to a Healthier You! workshops to parents and caregivers in the City of Santa Clara, providing strategies to implement healthy habits in the home.

Of those who attended a 10 Steps workshop:

- 97% felt that they had learned new things;
- 97% felt that they are ready to go home and try new things;
- and 90% felt that the class was very or extremely valuable.

At the end of quarter three, Healthier Kids Foundation has identified 54 children with untreated vision problems, 31 children with urgent or emergency dental needs and 71 children with a potential hearing problem in the City of Santa Clara.

Healthier Kids Foundation case managers are currently working with these families to ensure that the children receive appropriate treatment through their insurance. If uninsured, the case manager will assist the family in enrolling into subsidized health insurance. At the close of the quarter, case managers have help, 30 children have received glasses, 20 children received dental services and 2 children obtained hearing services from a pediatrician or specialist. Healthier Kids Foundation is still working with families whose cases are still open to ensure their children get the care they need to be healthy and successful. Healthier Kids Foundation is grateful for its partnership with the City of Santa Clara. Without it, these children's needs could have remained unidentified, unaddressed and may have created barriers to learning and hitting developmental milestones.

In addition to providing direct services to Santa Clara residents, Healthier Kids Foundation hosts City of Santa Clara Challenge Team meetings each month that brings together community partners to discuss the well-being of families in the city and resources that are available. For those that are interested in participating, Challenge Team meets on the second Wednesday of every month, from 12:00-1:30 PM, at the Community Recreation Center (969 Kiely Blvd., Santa Clara, CA 95051).
