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Overview

- The City contracted with Matrix Consulting Group in December 2018 to develop a comprehensive Cost of Services (User Fee) Study
- A Study Session was held on May 21,2019 to receive Council and public input for Phase I

Phase I of 2019/20 Municipal Fee Schedule – Introduction

- User Fees are described as fees for City services provided for the benefit of individual members of the public
- The last update to the fee schedule was approved by the City Council on May 8, 2018
- The Proposed Municipal Fee Schedule is a compilation of fees for City services provided to the public



Phase I of 2019/20 Municipal Fee Schedule – Introduction (cont.)

- This fee schedule contains 900+ fees; 70% of fees are eligible for a cost of services study, the remaining 30% are set by voter approval and/or state/federal law, etc.
- Fees that were not included as part of the Study were increased by:
 - 5.3% increase in Salary and Benefits for FY 2019/20; or
 - Consumer Price Index (CPI) factor outlined for that specific fee
- Separately published fee schedules not in this document are: Electric Rates, Water & Sewer Utility Rates, and Santa Clara Recreation Activity Charges



Phase I of 2019/20 Municipal Fee Schedule – Fee Setting Criteria

- Relinquish past practice of increasing fees by maximum increments of 25% to the extent that such increases did not exceed cost recovery
- Increase fees close to full cost recovery as possible without going over
- Strive to be in line with industry norms while recognizing that Library and Parks & Recreation Departments will never be at 100% cost recovery
- Delete any obsolete or irrelevant fees identified in the User Fee Study
- Decrease any over recovery fees to be in line with State law



Phase I of 2019/20 Municipal Fee Schedule – Highlights

- An increase in Technology Fee from 2.0% to 3.37% based upon the annual costs associated with maintenance and operation of the City's permitting system
- A consolidation of categories for Copy, City Charter, and Fax Machine into a singular category, "Copies" and charging a singular per page rate
- Converted current flat fee for Multi-Family (MF) Loan
 Subordination Request Review to a time and materials (Deposit)
 service in the Housing & Community Services Division

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Phase I of 2019/20 Municipal Fee Schedule – New Fees

- Twenty-eight (28) new fees have been added to the fee schedule
- New fees recover the costs for services that the City provides but had not charged for in the past

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Phase I of 2019/20 Municipal Fee Schedule – Summary

- The proposed 2019/20 Municipal Fee Schedule Phase I results in a reduction of the General Fund Subsidy of \$0.5M
 - \$0.25M of the General Fund reduction will be a direct result of increasing the Technology Fee from 2.0% to 3.37%
- Fees contained in the 2019/20 Municipal Fee Schedule will be effective August 1, 2019

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Phase I of 2019/20 Municipal Fee Schedule – Conclusion

- Adopting the Proposed Municipal Fee Schedule is an important component of the City's financial strategy
- This schedule adheres to the City Council 2019 adopted Budget Principle that establishes fees based on full cost recovery, with limited exceptions
- Dates for Phases II and III will be included on a future TMAC in the August-September timeframe

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Recommendation

 Staff recommends that the Council adopt a resolution for the City of Santa Clara 2019/20 Municipal Fee Schedule, effective August 1, 2019

Dear Mayor Gillmor, Councilmembers and City Manager Santana,

The library is one of the very few city owned places that stays open till 9 PM.

That makes the library room rentals a very sought after resource for meetings of community groups.

Unfortunately, the prices are very steep.

I see that costs for meeting rooms for Parks and Rec buildings are to be considered in Phase 2 but that does not seem to be the case for library rooms as you can see below:

I fail to see why a library meeting room should be \$50/hour while a Parks and Rec room should be only \$18/meeting for a non-profit.

Also I don't know why there is no differentiation between for-profit and non-profits in pricing of library rooms.

We should be trying to encourage more community groups in the City.

Please move adoption of fees for library rooms to Phase 2 to be considered at the same time as Parks and Rec rooms.

I realize that Standard and Minor Use permits will be considered in Phase 2 but I ask you to give guidance to the Community Development department to relax the pricing of Use permits for live music since currently at live music permit is \$9931 but an alcohol permit is only \$5108. Seems to me that a restaurant that doesn't charge cover charges should be able to get both together for \$5108.




The following graphs display sentiments for comments that have location data. Only locations of users who have commented will be shown.

I see in the proposed municipal fee schedule that a Standard Use permit fee is \$9931 and the Minor Use permit fee is \$5108. I see from the document that this will be considered in Phase 2. I urge Council to provide guidance to the Planning department to substantially reduce or eliminate the fees for live music at least to below the fee for an alcohol permit (which is only a minor use permit of \$5108). I realize that a restaurant that has both alcohol and live music can bundle the two permits.
