Mental Health Initiative Grant

- SCCL will receive 60+ titles related to mental health for the collection
- Will provide 4 months of training to 5 staff members on topics such as trauma, trauma stewardship, understanding community need, and creating effective programs around mental health
- Culminate in a community action in May to recognize mental health awareness month

- A volunteer orientation was held on 10/9 at CPL and tutor Training was held on Oct 19 and 20 at Mission for 15 new volunteer tutors.
- An in service workshop was held for current tutors on Oct 11.
- Family Literacy events were held at CPL, Scott Lane and Montague Elementary Schools and at the Family Literacy Resource Center of SCUSD.
- Tutor.com live demo sessions were held for groups at the Family Resource Center as well as for adult learners at Central Park Library
- RSC staff manned a table at the Resource Fair at SCUSD on 11/6.
- 26 new library cards were issued in the past month as a result of outreach efforts.

- Testing new public print software.
- IT is losing 15 year employee Angie Vincenti to retirement.





Facilities

- Central Library
 - Lighting problems in Redwood & Margie:
 - 9/26 During an evening program one of the ceiling lights in Redwood began to smoke. Fire Dept was dispatched and room was evacuated. Mechanical Maintenance on site the following day to troubleshoot and discovered melted housing on several bulbs, unable to determine cause. Smoking/melting of bulbs soon followed in Margie room.
 - Due to urgency of resolving this issue cancelled vacation to coordinate site visit with software manufacturer ASAP to determine cause of melting/smoking fixtures.
 - Outcome/resolution:
 - Problem not initiated by software malfunction
 - Potentially "bad" box of bulbs &/or
 - Change in materials used in manufacturing bulbs caused housing to smoke
 - Mechanical Maintenance replaced all old bulbs in Margie & Redwood the first week or October. This seems to have resolved the problem, monitoring continues.



Facilities - continued

- Roof & gutter cleaning & repairs completed
- Mission Library
 - Fire system skylight repairs completed
- Northside Library
 - Coordinated painting of lobby ceiling with Building Maintenance saving \$5,000 from the O&M budget
