- At the age of 16, Tommy joined the US Army. He was honorably discharged at the age of 24 due to an injury, receiving two bronze star medals.
- After his military service, Tommy earned his bachelor's degree in Business and went on to earn his MBA from Harvard Business School.
- In 1981, Tommy accepted the CEO position at Economic and Social Opportunities, a non-profit organization, and moved to San Jose, CA with his wife and two sons.

- He spent the next two decades volunteering across Santa Clara County on nearly two dozen boards and commissions. He was a well-known leader, respected in almost every sector of the community.
