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#### Background

- March 24, 2020: City Council adopted an urgency ordinance and approved an introduction of an ordinance to establish a temporary moratorium on evictions due to Covid-19
- March 24, 2020: County of Santa Clara adopted an eviction moratorium that applies to all the cities within the County. This ordinance remains in effect through the Local Emergency and landlords may seek past rent 120 days after its expiration.
- March 27, 2020: Governor issued an executive order establishing a statewide moratorium on evictions through May 31, 2020.

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#### What the updated Ordinance does:

- Aligns with the State and County regulations with regards to expiration date and timeframe to seek rent owed.
- Allows Landlord to seek past rent 120 days after the expiration of the ordinance.
- The ordinance will go into effect on May 28, 2020, and may be extended by resolution for 30-day periods.
- The Urgency Ordinance adopted on March 24, 2020 will remain in place until the regular ordinance is effective.

Revision to SCCC Section 8.65.020 B

B. The moratorium will commence upon adoption by City Council of a Resolution setting forth the facts and circumstances for activation and shall expire thirty (30) days after adoption <u>of the Resolution</u>, unless the <u>Ordinance Resolution</u> is <u>further otherwise</u> extended <u>by a</u> <u>subsequent resolution</u> <del>approval</del> of the City Council.
