

RESOLUTION NO.

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY OF SANTA CLARA, CALIFORNIA RECITING THE FACTS OF THE CONSOLIDATED MUNICIPAL SPECIAL ELECTION HELD IN THE CITY OF SANTA CLARA ON March 3, 2020, WITH THE STATEWIDE PRESIDENTIAL PRIMARY ELECTION DECLARING THE RESULTS OF THE ELECTION AND SUCH OTHER MATTERS AS PROVIDED BY LAW

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY OF SANTA CLARA AS FOLLOWS:

WHEREAS, a Consolidated Municipal Special Election was held and conducted in the City of Santa Clara, on Tuesday, March 3, 2020, as required by law;

WHEREAS, notice of the election was given in time, form and manner as provided by law; that voting precincts were properly established; that election officers were appointed and that in all respects the election was held and conducted and the votes were cast, received and canvassed and the returns made and declared in time, form and manner as required by the provisions of the Elections Code of the State of California for holding of elections in charter cities; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Resolution No. 19-8762 and 19-8783 (a resolution calling for a consolidated special municipal election to be held on March 3, 2020 with the Statewide Presidential Primary election) adopted on October 8, 2019 and November 19, 2019, the County Registrar of Voters canvassed the returns of the election and has certified to this City Council, the results are received, attached and made part of hereof as Exhibit A and B.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED BY THE CITY OF SANTA CLARA AS FOLLOWS:

1. That the total number of votes (ballots): 27,972
2. That the names of the persons voted for at the election for Chief of Police: Pat Nikolai
3. That the number of votes given at each precinct and the number of votes given in the City to the person above named for the respective office for which the person was a candidate and is listed in the attached Exhibits A and B.
4. That the City Council does declare and determine that: Pat Nikolai was elected as Chief

of Police for a partial term ending 2020.

5. That the City does declare and determine that Measure C City of Santa Clara Charter Amendment on District Council Elections was defeated with results as follows: votes in favor of Measure C – 9,731; and votes against Measure C – 15,458.

6. That the Assistant City Clerk shall certify to the passage and adoption of this resolution and enter into the book of original resolutions.

7. Constitutionality, severability. If any section, subsection, sentence, clause, phrase, or word of this resolution is for any reason held by a court of competent jurisdiction to be unconstitutional or invalid for any reason such decision shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions of the resolution. The City of Santa Clara, California, hereby declares that it would have passed this resolution and each section, subsection, sentence, clause phrase, and word thereof, irrespective of the fact that any one or more section(s), subsection(s), sentence(s), clause(s), phrase(s), or word(s) be declared invalid.

8. Effective date. This resolution shall become effective immediately.
