2018-2019 CIP Budget General Plan Conformance

Enhancing the City's High Quality of Life

Mission Library Gazebo

- Design concept study to facilitate placemaking at the Gazebo
- Categorically Exempt under CEQA (existing facilities)





Quality of Services

Laurelwood Substation

- New 100 MVA single customer substation for a proposed data center
- CEQA: Laurelwood Data Center Initial Study and Mitigated Negative Declaration, prepared by the California Energy Commission





Quality of Services - Mobility and Transportation

Hetch-Hetchy Trail Phase 1

- Constructs 0.3 miles of a 12-foot wide Class I bicycle and pedestrian facility along the Hetch-Hetchy right-of-way from Stars and Stripes Drive to San Tomas Aquino Creek
- Contingent on approval of the Creek Trail Master Plan
- Exempt per CEQA Guidelines
 Section 15262, feasibility studies
