What is Neighborhood Watch?

- **Crime Prevention Program** Enlists the active participation of neighborhoods in cooperation with police to reduce crime
- Neighbors getting to know each other, looking out for one another, and working together around a common cause – Safety and security
- Learning and implementing crime prevention strategies Recognizing and reporting suspicious activity/crimes and home security measures
- The best crime prevention device ever invented is a neighbor!



Neighborhood Watch

- Law enforcement officers cannot be on every corner, therefore community help was initiated
- 130 neighborhood watch groups have been established in Santa Clara since 1987

Neighborhood Watch Meetings can include conversations on a variety of topics, including:

- Crime statistics
- · Identifying suspicious or criminal activity
- Crime reporting (e.g. emergency vs non-emergency)
- Financial crimes and scams
- · Bicycle thefts and bicycle registry
- Vehicle security
- Environmental design (e.g. landscaping, lighting, etc.) as a deterrent
- Home burglary prevention tips
- Mail and package theft reduction

Potential Program Name Change

- Throughout the U.S. there are many names for the program our City refers to as Neighborhood Watch, yet all have the same concept
- The Police Department is evaluating all aspects of its community programs and services. A name change would allow the Department to move away from a "watch" concept to one that appears more collaborative in spirit. Potential names include:
 - Police Neighborhood Outreach
 - Neighborhood Police Partnership
- Should the Police Department proceed with a name change, it will develop a phased plan to
 update the website, program flyers and communication plan to the community. At a later
 date, the signs hung in neighborhoods throughout the City would be adjusted to reflect the
 new program name
