Catherine Marie Pedone, 90-Year Santa Clara Resident, Former Santa Clara Unified School District Employee, and Volunteer at Kaiser Permanente Hospital, Santa Clara

- Catherine "Kay" Marie Pedone was born on September 25, 1925.
- Originally from Port Henry, New York, Kay was a 90-year resident of Santa Clara.
- She dedicated her career to the Santa Clara Unified School District where she worked for nearly 30 years, mostly in the cafeteria.
- After her retirement, Kay joined volunteer services at Kaiser Permanente Santa Clara where she stayed for nearly 20 years; her many years of service are commemorated with a brick in the hospital courtyard.
- Kay's kind nurturing nature and her love of cooking and baking were also omnipresent in her family home, which always had an open-door policy, with coffee brewing and cookies at the ready.
- A woman of God and strongly grounded in her faith, Kay's life revolved around service, her family and friends.
- Kay Pedone passed away on September 21, 2020 at the age of 95.
- She is preceded in death by the love of her life Santo (Sam) Pedone and beloved son Salvadore.

- In 2019, Joan was honored with the Women of Persistence Award for her work helping girls in our region get exposure to STEM careers.
- Joan passed away on October 2, 2020, just having celebrated her 88th birthday.
