The time limit within which to commence any lawsuit or legal challenge to any quasi-adjudicative decision made by the City is governed by Section 1094.6 of the Code of Civil Procedure, unless a shorter limitation period is specified by any other provision. Under Section 1094.6, any lawsuit or legal challenge to any quasi-adjudicative decision made by the City must be filed no later than the 90th day following the date on which such decision becomes final. Any lawsuit or legal challenge, which is not filed within that 90-day period, will be barred. If a person wishes to challenge the nature of the above section in court, they may be limited to raising only those issues they or someone else raised at the meeting described in this notice, or in written correspondence delivered to the City of Santa Clara, at or prior to the meeting. In addition, judicial challenge may be limited or barred where the interested party has not sought and exhausted all available administrative remedies.

AB23 ANNOUNCEMENT: Members of the Santa Clara Stadium Authority, Sports and Open Space Authority and Housing Authority are entitled to receive \$30 for each attended meeting.

Senior Deputy City Attorney reported Closed Session Item E, that the Council unanimously voted to approve the settlement with Wells Fargo Bank and the County of Santa Clara Housing Authority relating to lost interest on guaranteed funds provided by the City on two County Multi-Family Housing Bonds, issued in 2001 for the John Burns and RiverTown Projects as follows:

- Wells Fargo Bank will pay a lump sum of \$363,998.74 to the guarantee account on the RiverTown Bond and will make periodic payments through 2032 on the RiverTown Project

- Wells Fargo Bank will pay a lump sum of \$357,016.70 to the John Burns Bond and make periodic payments through 2035 on the John Burns Project

Both Projects will reflect earned interest per year. Taken together the lump sums and periodic payments will make the City guaranteed funds whole.
