SUBJECT

Youth Commission 2018-19 Work Plan & Goals Update

BACKGROUND

The Youth Commission develops an annual work plan for each term which is created through a discussion of current trends relating to the youth and teen population. In the 2017-18 term the following goals were selected based on priority and community needs: foster inclusiveness in the community; increase intergenerational awareness and opportunities; and increase youth understanding and participation in local government.

DISCUSSION

Youth Commissioners will begin narrowing the focus of discussed topics and ideas for the 2018-19 term work plan, and potentially develop and select actionable objectives. Commissioners will consider feedback from the Council and Commission Joint Meeting held on October 9, 2018. Themes include: Fostering Inclusiveness, Health and Wellness, Youth in Government, and Environmentalism.
